

On June 1, 1981, two young activists, Silme Domingo and Gene Viernes, were murdered in Seattle in what was made to appear like a gang slaying. The victims' families and friends suspected they were considered a threat to Phillipines dicatator Ferdinand Marcos and his regime's relationship to the United States.
